

Short Sermon on Lamentations 3:22–23

Scripture:

*"It is of the Lord's mercies that we are not consumed, because his compassion's fail not. They are new every morning: great is thy faithfulness."
– Lamentations 3:22–23 (KJV)*

Sermon Title: “New Every Morning”

These verses from Lamentations come from a book filled with sorrow, pain, and devastation. Jerusalem had fallen. The people were broken. But in the middle of this storm, Jeremiah pauses and remembers something powerful—*God’s mercy*. Even in suffering, God’s compassion had not run out. In fact, it was being *renewed every morning*.

This teaches us that no matter how bad yesterday was—whether we failed, struggled, or felt like giving up—God offers a fresh start today. His mercy doesn't run dry. His love doesn't wear thin. He is faithful.

Illustration Story:

There was once a man named John who hit rock bottom. He lost his job, his home, and even his family due to addiction. He ended up living on the streets, full of shame and regret. One cold morning, sitting behind a church, he heard someone singing inside:

**“Great is Thy faithfulness, O God my Father,
There is no shadow of turning with Thee...”**

Something stirred in him. He walked inside, sat in the back, and wept. After the service, someone offered him a meal and a listening ear. That moment was a turning point. Slowly, through rehab and the help of believers, John rebuilt his life. When asked what changed him, he said,

"It was knowing God still cared—that His mercy was waiting for me even when I had nothing left to offer."

Conclusion:

Friend, you may feel overwhelmed, guilty, or worn out. But God's mercy is not based on your strength—it flows from His character. And His compassion's never fail.

Tomorrow's mercy is already on the way.

Let us rise each morning with hope, knowing: “Great is Thy faithfulness.”
